Funding Sources

The Charity is financially supported by donations from members, companies/corporations, well-wishers and the general public.

Memberships

Current membership strength: 333 (comprising 324 Life & Annual Members and 9 Corporate Members).

Primary Function

The Foundation is open to the public for participation in its charitable activities geared towards helping needy arthritis patients and patient education.

Besides providing financial subsidy to patients to defray their expensive medical treatment, NAF also provides financial assistance for medical aids and transportation for needy Arthritis Patients.

REVIEW OF YEAR 2016

Staffing

As at 31 December 2016, there were 3 full-time staff employed by the Charity. Plans are afoot to recruit 1 to 2 more headcounts in the near future.

Activities

- Processing applications for Medical Subsidy from the MSWs of restructured hospitals for their needy arthritis patients
- Publication of 6-monthly newsletter, i.e. once/twice a year
- Printing and dissemination of Patient Education Pamphlets
- Weekly physiotherapy sessions for Ankylosing Spondylitis patients
- Weekly Tai-Chi sessions
- Weekly Yoga for Arthritis sessions
- Organising Patient Support events
- Organising Fund-Raising events

Fundraising Event and Activity

Two Fund-Raising charity events were organised by NAF on 14 Jul 2016 (Gala Dinner) and on 17 Nov 2016 (Golf Tournament) to raise money for NAF's general fund to help meets its objectives in patient treatment subsidy, patient education and general operations. A total amount of \$620,750 was raised from these two events.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL STATE AND EXPLANATION OF MAJOR FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS

The Foundation has a surplus of \$281,195 in FY2016, with a balance of Funds of \$825,355 as at 31 Dec 2016.

Top 3 donors are SICC (\$85,000), Tote Board (\$83,625), Triangle Auto (\$35,000) respectively whilst top 3 payments to vendors were as follows:

- a) SICC (\$39,060.88) for Charity Golf event and co-payment for May Day event
- b) Crosstrade Solutions (\$37,571) for Gala Dinner & Golf event management
- c) Shangri-la (\$36,157.44) for Gala Dinner event
